

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RELATING TO THE TEMPORARY LIMITATION OF CERTAIN LAND USES WITHIN THE PROPOSED PD-30 AREA IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as

follows:

Purpose.

At the direction of the City Council, the Departments of Planning and Building and Community Development are currently studying and reviewing a program to develop a comprehensive change to the zoning regulations, zoning districts and permitted land uses in and around the area described as the "Area of Temporary Limitation" (the "Area"), which Area is depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Neighborhood concerns have been expressed that changes to existing zoning regulations, zoning districts and permitted land uses are desired and that premature development or implementation of certain uses in the Area may defeat the effectiveness of zoning regulations ultimately adopted for the Area as a result of the current study and review.

Sec. 2. Prohibition. No application for a conditional use permit, administrative use parmit, building or other permit of any kind shall be accepted or approved, nor shall any such permit be issued, for those uses described in Section 3 of this ordinance

#### Sec. 3. Temporarily Prohibited Land Uses.

- A. "Community dorrectional re-entry center" as that term is defined in Section 21.15.602 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- B. "Dormitories" which are defined as public, private or institutional facilities intended principally for sleeping accommodations and where no individual kitchen facilities are provided. This definition does not include hotels or motels.
- c. "Firearms dealer" or "firearms repair establishment" which are defined as businesses or individuals engaged in the commercial sale, exchange or repair of firearms and related objects normally dealt with by a licensed firearms dealer.
- D. "Massage establishment" or "massage parlor" as those terms are defined in Sections 5.58.010D and 21.15.110F of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- E. 'Pawnshop," "pawn office" or "pawnbroker" as those terms are defined in Section 5.64.010A and B of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- F. "Recycling center" or "collection centers for recyclables" which are defined as a person or entity having a fixed place of business, whether attended or unattended, and engaging in conducting, managing, or carrying on the business of buying, collecting, selling, or etherwise charging or re-selling for re-use, metal, aluminum, plastic, glass, paper, rags, cardboard, oil,

batteries, and/or similar items.

- G. "Residential care facilities" as that term is defined in Section 21.15.2290 of the Long Beach Municipal Code. For the purpose of this definition, the prohibition established pursuant to Section 2 of this ordinance shall only apply to those facilities providing service to seven (7) or more persons.
- H. "Boardinghouse" or "lodginghouse" as those terms are defined in Sections 21.15.390 and 21.15.1580 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- I. "Shelter" as that term is defined in Section 21.15.2475 of the Long Beach Municipal Code. Nothing contained in this ordinance shall limit the City's ability to declare a "shelter crisis" within the meaning of California Government Code Section 8698.2.
- J. "Social service office" which is defined as an office maintained and used as a place of business conducted by persons or entities engaged in offering on-site group counselling, treatment or recovery programs, but wherein no overnight care for patients or clients is given. For the purpose of this definition, "group" means three or more.
- K. "Swap meet" or "display/selling event" as those terms are defined in Sections 5.65.0108 and E of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- 2. "Tattoo parlor" as that term is defined in Section 21.15.2990 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.
- M. "Transitional housing or detention facilities for parolees or probationers" which are defined as public, private or institutional facilities providing lodging, supervision, detention

and/or rehabilitation services on up to and including a twenty-four (34) hour per day basis to paroless, probationers or those participating in work-release or work-furlough ;atl release programs.

prohibit or restrict any land use that is otherwise specifically authorized or permitted by state or federal law.

Sec. 5. <u>Declaration of Urgency</u>. This ordinance is an emergency measure, and it is urgently required for the reason that, pending completion of a planning review, study, and determination relating to the affected Area, it is necessary to limit development or land uses in the affected Area in order to avoid premature development or implementation of uses that might be inconsistent with the ultimate development and land uses proposed and permitted for this Area as a result of pending revisions to the zoning regulations of the City being considered for the Area.

Sec. 6. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance duly adopted by the City Council by a vote of five of its members and shall take effect immediately. The City Clark shall certify to a separate roll call and vote on the question of the emergency of this ordinance and to its passage by the vote of five members of the City Council of the City of Long Beach, and cause the same to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach.

This ordinance shall also be adopted by the City Council as a regular ordinance, so she end that in the event of any defect

or invalidity in connection with the adoption of this ordinance as an emergency ordinance, the same shall, nevertheless, be and become effective on the thirty-first day after it is approved by the Mayor. The City Clerk shall tertify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council of the City of Long Beach and shall cause the same to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach.
