

Mental illnesses such as schizophrenia, severe depression and manic-depressive illness usually hit during the teens and early adult years. That's the time when young men and women are just beginning to find their way in the world. They're breaking away from their childhood homes and deciding on the career path they want to follow.


Mental illness can keep them dependent on family members, call a halt to their education and stymie their social growth.

Project Return, established in 1980, and Project Return: The Next Step (PR:TNS) --- the organization that has evolved from it --- were designed to change all that.

PR:TNS is a network of member-operated self-help clubs in Los Angeles County. Its mission is to offer people with mental illnesses social opportunities and promote self-esteem and community involvement while encouraging and empowering leadership.

Its goal is to become its own independent, consumer-run non-profit organization by the Year 2000

The Next Step "Taking Charge Together"



As paid club aides, members operate clubs all across Los Angeles County. They are assisted by paid regional aides who, in turn, are supervised by a salaried program director and provided staff support by a paid administrative assistant.

Clubs meet in homes and in community centers in the San Gabriel, San Fernando and Antelope valleys. They get together in Hollywood, San Pedro and Long Beach. And they meet in Los Angeles' Westside, Southeast, South-Central, Central and East Los Angeles regions.

A variety of clubs have been developed to meet the needs of members with various special concerns. Clubs have been organized for monolingual members, gay and lesbian consumers, married and live-in couples and working clients who aren't able to make day-time club meetings.



All clubs stimulate creativity, foster self-esteem and advocate for the needs of their members, some of whom not only have mental but physical disabilities as well.

Individual club activities are based on the members' interests. Among the favorite pastimes are playing board games, taking in a movie, strolling through museums, matching skills at a bowling alley and trying out new area restaurants.

All-club activities include an annual Awards Picnic where individual members' achievements are recognized, a four-day weekend out of town and planned excursions to local amusement parks, sports events and live theater openings.

Membership is without charge and open to all Los Angeles men and women with psychiatric disabilities.
