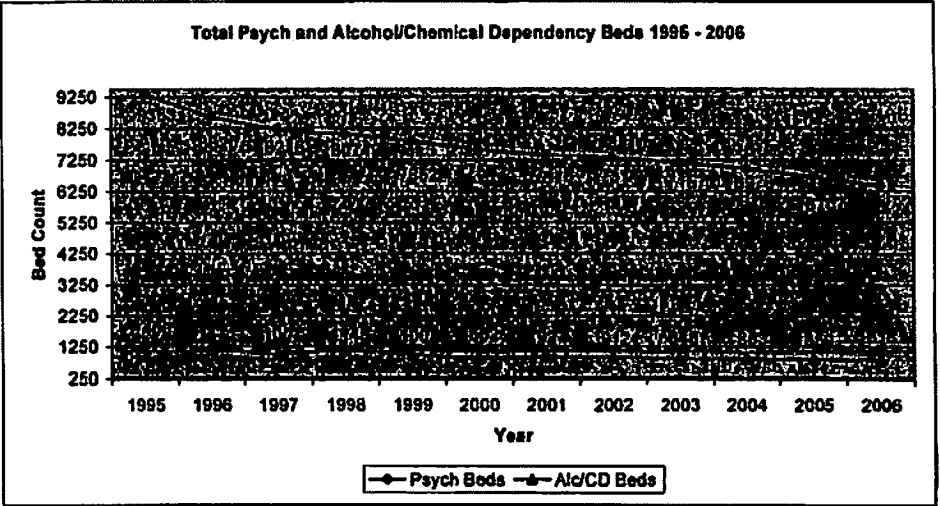

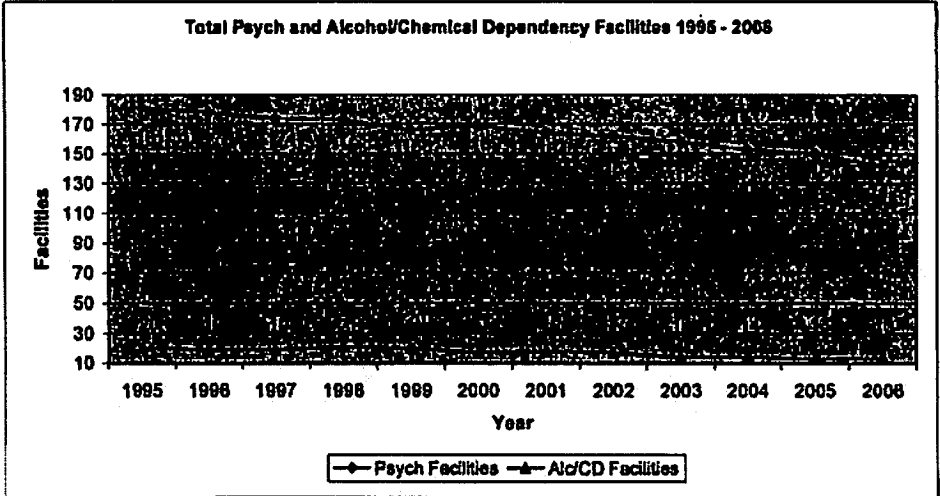

PHP (Psychiatric Health Facility) - A health facility, licensed by the State Department of Mental Health, that provides 24-hour inpatient care. This care includes, but is not limited to: psychiatry, clinical psychology, psychiatric nursing, social work, rehabilitation, drug administration, and appropriate food services for those persons whose physical health needs can be met in an affiliated hospital or in outpatient settings.

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
